

Reading: Genesis 12: 1 - 9 (p. 13)

The Call of Abram

1 The LORD had said to Abram, "Go from your country, your people and your father's household to the land I will show you.

2 "I will make you into a great nation, and I will bless you; I will make your name great, and you will be a blessing.

- **3** I will bless those who bless you, and whoever curses you I will curse; and all peoples on earth will be blessed through you."
- **4** So Abram went, as the LORD had told him; and Lot went with him. Abram was seventy-five years old when he set out from Harran.
- **5** He took his wife Sarai, his nephew Lot, all the possessions they had accumulated and the people they had acquired in Harran, and they set out for the land of Canaan, and they arrived there.
- **6** Abram traveled through the land as far as the site of the great tree of Moreh at Shechem. At that time the Canaanites were in the land.
- **7** The LORD appeared to Abram and said, "To your offspring I will give this land." So he built an altar there to the LORD, who had appeared to him.
- **8** From there he went on toward the hills east of Bethel and pitched his tent, with Bethel on the west and Ai on the east. There he built an altar to the LORD and called on the name of the LORD.
- 9 Then Abram set out and continued toward the Negev.

- 1 The God of Abraham praise, who reigns enthroned above, Ancient of everlasting days, and God of love. Jehovah, great I AM! by earth and heaven confessed; we bow and bless the sacred name, for ever blest.
- 2 The God of Abraham praise, at whose supreme command from earth we rise, and seek the joys at His right hand; we all on earth forsake, its wisdom, fame, and power;

and Him our only portion make, our shield and tower.

4 He by Himself has sworn –
we on His oath depend –
we shall, on eagles' wings upborne,
to heaven ascend:
we shall behold His face,
we shall His power adore,
and sing the wonders of His grace
for evermore.

Praise: Will you come and follow me? (CH4 533)

- 1 Will you come and follow me if I but call your name? Will you go where you don't know and never be the same? Will you let my love be shown, will you let my name be known, will you let my life be grown in you and you in me?
- Will you leave yourself behind if I but call your name? Will you care for cruel and kind and never be the same? Will you risk the hostile stare should your life attract or scare? Will you let me answer prayer in you and you in me?
- 3 Will you let the blinded see if I but call your name? Will you set the prisoners free and never be the same? Will you kiss the leper clean, and do such as this unseen, and admit to what I mean in you and you in me?
- 4 Will you love the 'you' you hide if I but call your name? Will you quell the fear inside and never be the same?

Will you use the faith you've found to reshape the world around, through my sight and touch and sound in you and you in me?

5 Lord, your summons echoes true when you but call my name. Let me turn and follow you and never be the same. In your company I'll go where your love and footsteps show. Thus I'll move and live and grow in you and you in me.
