Presbytery Report - Brussels 2023

Last weekend, along with Molly, Irene, Ruud and Dee, the minister attended the **International Presbytery (IP)** meeting in Brussels. As always, this is my third in-person meeting, it was good to reconnect with colleagues from across Europe. In this short article I want to share with you one or two things that affect us here at the Scots International Church.

- 1. I have been appointed as **Interim Moderator** of Lausanne as Rev Gillean McLean retires at the end of June. This means ensuring that the Kirk Session and congregation follow all the necessary procedures to hopefully have as short a vacancy as possible. They have been allowed to call a full-time Church of Scotland minister. In the present Presbytery Plan Lausanne will eventually be linked with Geneva when their present minister retires.
- 2. **Joanne Evans-Boiten**, known to some of you, has been appointed as Moderator of the IP. That means in October when the Presbytery comes to Rotterdam, she will be leading our Sunday morning worship. Please pray for her in the coming year.
- 3. The **IP** debated about the cost to put on a Presbytery meeting and certain changes are being considered. If things remain as they are then our Presbytery dues will be affected. A final decision is deferred until October.
- 4. The **Property Committee of Presbytery** are aware of our building issues and can help us to obtain any necessary permissions as soon as all required quotes and forms are presented. Our own Consistory and sub-committee, the Finance and Governance team are working on this serious issue. It is important to remember that we are not a church on our own. We belong to an **International Presbytery** which in turn belongs within the wider **Church of Scotland**. Of course, we are also part of the world-wide Christian community. As we continue to move forward as a church let us pray for our sister congregations locally, and internationally, that we may seek to bring glory to God as we live as the body of Christ.
