Happy Mother's Day

Mothering Sunday was once a major tradition in the UK and other parts of Europe, falling on the fourth Sunday of Lent. It was seen as a time when the faithful would return to their "mother church" or the main church in the area, for a special service.

Over time, the Mothering Sunday holiday became a more secular holiday, where children would gift their mothers flowers or other tokens of appreciation. In 1914, President Woodrow Wilson signed a measure which officially established the second Sunday of May as Mother's Day, a day for children to honour their mothers. The Dutch Mother's Day (Moederdag) was also introduced by the Salvation Army in 1916. Regardless of this history may God bless all with mothering qualities.
