ways to give

- 1. You can give by cash during themorning service through the open plate. It may be helpful to order envelopes that you can fill in each week and bring them with you to any, or all, services you attend. We are asking you to consider, if you are able, to increase your giving by €3 per week. Some of you will be able to exceed that amount but if you are finding that your finances are stretched at this time you should, without guilt, reduce what you give.
- 2. You could set up a weekly, monthly orannual bank transfer so that your offering is paid directly to the church bank account. This ensures your giving is regular and helps the Treasurer to plan ahead with confidence. The banking details are on the back page.

3. One-off financial gifts are always welcome and perhaps you might consider giving to the church on a special occasion, during a church fund raising event and, of course, contributing to the tea and coffee after the service.

ways to help

- 1. We are hoping to make our buildings fitfor purpose for our own needs and attractive as a rental space for the wider community. Therefore, we need to redecorate our building throughout. One idea is that an individual, or a group, could sponsor a room and donate a gift for the refurbishment of that room. What practical help can you offer? Please let us know.
- 2. We need to improve what we can provide for example our technical facilities. We already

have Wi-Fi throughout the building with a guest login but other improvements can be made.

3. Finally we need to find ways to reduceour expenditure through cost cutting for example our heating needs, electrical use and making use of reusable products e.g., hand towels. Other small things we can do are, for example, remembering to switch off lights when you are last to leave the church buildings and to inform the church if your meeting is cancelled so the heating can be turned off.
